The program will feature works by Thomas Tallis, Thomas Morley and Henry Purcell, including excerpts from Purcell's Dido and Aeneas (1689). Celebrating its 17th year at Regis, under the direction of its founder, Dr. Mark Davenport, the ensemble will be accompanied by this year's Artist-in-Residence Sémplice Baroque (Miriam Rosenblum, recorders; Carla Sciaky baroque violin and tenor viol; and Ben Cohen, archlute and recorder). Also performing are Joy Adams, baroque cello, and Karl Reque, baroque viola and bass viol. Supporting the student choir is baritone and assistant to the director Adam Ewing (also playing harpsichord), and tenor Bob Reynolds.
